**RE: Your complaint dated February 2, 2025, bearing reference number SEBIE/DH25/NORT/005784/1 (“Complaint”) filed on SEBI Complaint Redressal System platform (“SCORES”) in relation to the draft red herring prospectus dated December 6, 2024 (“DRHP”) filed by LG Electronics India Limited (the “Company”) for the initial public offering of its equity shares (“Offer”)**

Dear Mr. Pandey,

This is in relation to the Complaint, seeking clarification whether our Company is in compliance of the environmental laws including but not limited to the extended producer’s responsibility certificate.

Please note that our Company has been in compliance with the applicable environmental laws specified in the section titled “*Key Regulations and Policies – Environmental legislations*” on pages 194 and 195 of the DRHP. Further, please note that our Company has obtained extended producer’s responsibility registration certificates under the E-waste (Management) Rules, 2022, for its Noida Manufacturing Unit and Pune Manufacturing Unit. Appropriate disclosures in this regard have been made under “*Government and Other Approvals – Material Approvals in relation to the business and operations of our Company – Noida Manufacturing Unit*” and “*Government and Other Approvals – Material Approvals in relation to the business and operations of our Company – Pune Manufacturing Unit*” respectively, on page 361 of the DRHP.

Further, please note that the Central Pollution Control Board, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India, issued the Guidelines for Environment Compensation under the E-waste (Management) Rules, 2022 on September 9, 2024 (“**EPR Guidelines**”) that fixed the lowest price for exchange of the extended producer’s responsibility certificate, however, certain industry participants have challenged the EPR Guidelines before the High Court of Delhi on the ground that such EPR Guidelines are arbitrary, unreasonable and *ultra vires* the Environment Protection Act, 1986. While our Company has not yet filed a petition before any judicial forum challenging the EPR Guidelines, our Company is currently evaluating whether any such action should be taken by it.

All capitalized terms not defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed to such terms in the DRHP.

We trust this clarifies the issues raised in the Complaint.
